**Duties and Responsibilities of the Golf Coach at each School**

The Golf coach is responsible for the direction of his/her program and in charge with the behavior, safety, welfare and improvement of the golf team during practices, games, season and tenure. Our coaches will operate their program adhering to the philosophy of the M.I.A.A. and the Memphis City Schools. Our Golf instructors are expected to communicate with the M.I.A.A. Golf Director, Coach Randy Perry about foreseen problems or recommendations of this program. Our coaches must be fully aware of all legal responsibilities of their players, keep records and statistics and set the pattern for public relations that reflects the goals of his/her program and the M.I.A.A. Our Head Golf coach is ultimately responsible for the administration of this program and must delegate appropriate responsibilities to volunteer assistant coaches.

All Golf coaches must be CPR certified and first aid trained to handle minor injuries. A copy of your card shall be on file with your school Athletic Director

The Golf coach is responsible for reviewing and explaining all Athletic Department rules from their respected schools, M.I.A.A./MCS rules and policies during parents' meetings. (Please have a copy of the MCS athletic rules for grades while participating in athletics during the school year)

An accident/injury form of all injuries or accidents must be completed by the Head Golf coach and be submitted to the main office secretary along with a copy to the MIAA Golf Director immediately after the incident.

Each coach must submit a **TMSAA Eligibility Form** to the MIAA office and to the TSSAA also along with a **TMSAA Schedule Form** of all matches, League and non-League.

All players must have a current physical on file with the schools Athletic Director.

The Memphis City Schools Golf Program is not and will not be a part of the TMSAA West Tennessee Golf League. We are a part of the State of Tennessee Athletic Association which is in Nashville called the TSSAA/TMSAA.

As a responsible coach, you may schedule matches between any other schools in this area, Private or county, but not through the league of the TMSAA Tennessee Golf Association. If you choose to participate in a tournament sponsored by the TMSAA Tennessee Golf Association with all middle school teams, this is permissible. But if one or more individuals or teams that are not sanctioned by our State organization, TMSAA of Nashville, you are not permitted to play.
