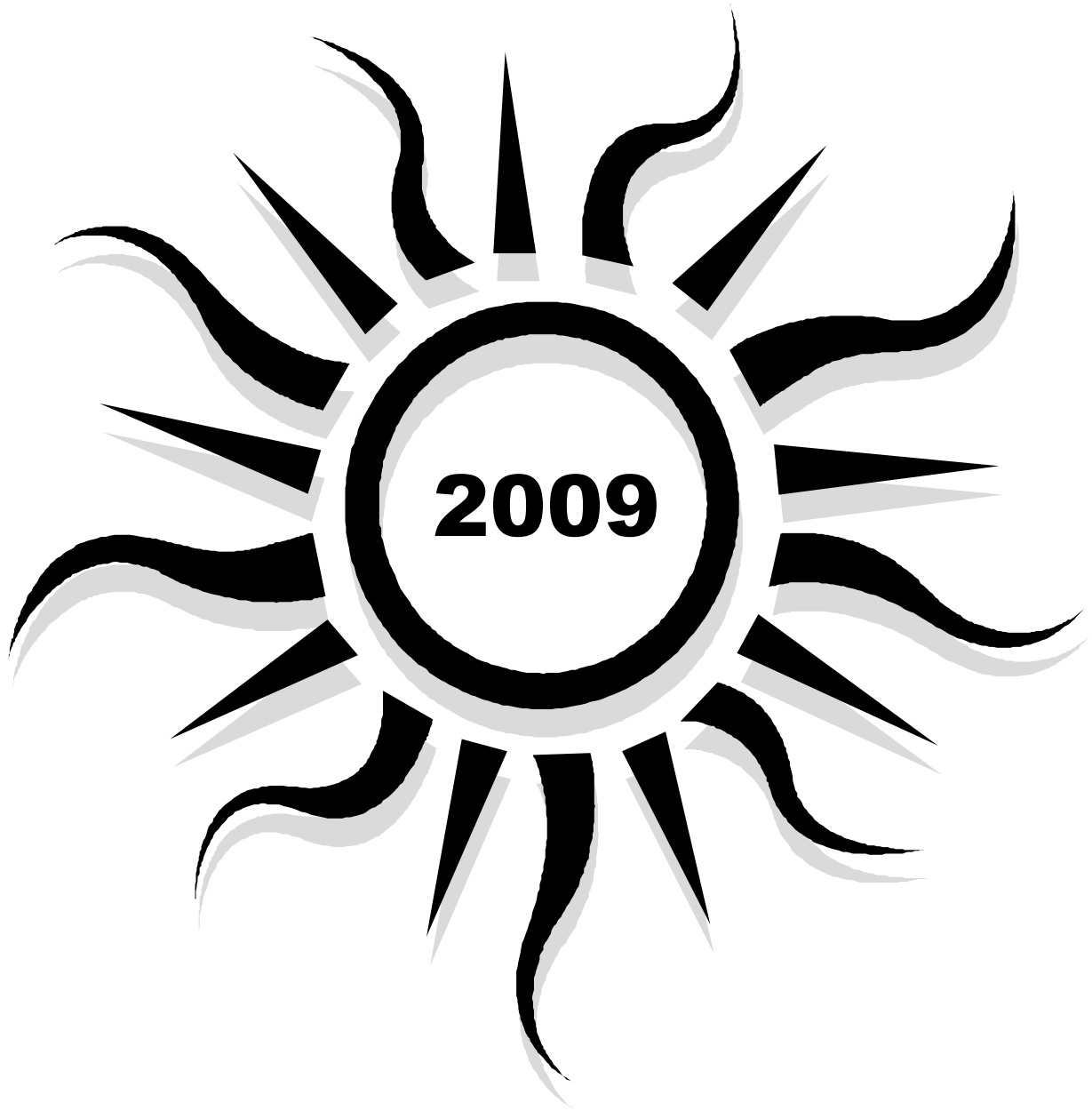

These services are provided consistent with the child's individualized education program (IEP) in order for him/her to receive a free appropriate public education (FAPE). The key issues are skill-regression during a break in services and limited skill recovery after services resume.

Echoes of Truth

Student Hours:	8:00am-2:00pm daily. Dress rehearsal day at The Orpheum Theatre may run longer. Performance day students return to The Orpheum for the evening performance. (There will be some pre-camp contracted work prior to the actual camp dates).
Description:	Echoes of Truth is an arts-centered career-training program in which students learn by doing. The program is conducted each summer in June at Overton High School in Memphis. Students in the Echoes program produce real products and are paid for their work. Echoes participants range in age from 16 to 21 and attend schools throughout Shelby County as well as area and regional colleges. Each year as a culminating event at the end of the summer session, students present a musical performance and art sale/auction at the Orpheum Theatre in Memphis. Revenue from ticket sales and the art auction are used to fund continuation of Echoes.
Courses Offered:	Echoes uses the Renaissance learning model of a “master” directing the work of “apprentices.” Students choose from a variety of business modules in which to serve their apprenticeship, including acting, vocal music, dance, songwriting, set design and production, visual art, videography, and arts marketing.
Materials/Resources:	All materials, resources, module supplies are purchased through the allocated funds for the program before, during and finalized after the performance prior to June 30th.
